EDISON PUBLIC LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

JUNE 13, 2023

These past few weeks have been those of completion and restart for the Library. Yes, it's still spring but we try and fall ahead with new ideas.

John has been working with the community to get the Bookmobile routes restarted. It's much harder than one would think. Robbie and I went out one afternoon in the van to chart the public sites. John has been making phone calls and visits to get approval for the Bookmobile to stop in community developments. We have determined that we are finalizing the routes that we have for now and will officially launch the Bookmobile on July 10th. Routes will be published and flyers distributed to help get the word out.

It's that time again, Summer Reading! Summer Reading is basically a 10-12 week time period of active programming in the Library from June thru August. It's our busiest time of the year with all hands on deck. Carolyn and the staff have done a great job in getting this to happen. Programs will be happening at all three branch locations and the Bookmobile. More details to come out shortly.

We are very excited about the newly envisioned Friends of the Edison Public Library. Plans are to schedule the first official meeting in July.

Pat Massey and I attended the Clara Barton Neighborhood Association Meeting. There are still lingering issues regarding the closing hovering over the community. We expect to attend this meeting once a month to help promote the Clara Barton Library to the neighborhood. Michael is working on a poster on the Clara Barton Library that we plan to "post" all over the neighborhood.

The self-check machines and security gates have been delivered. We expect that these will be installed in late July as we begin the process of tagging the collection for inventory control and RFID self-check-out.

The long awaiting project of upgrading the server and upgrading the network is scheduled for July. We may be down internet-wise for a day or two but we plan on compensating with the hot spots that we currently have. No exact date is set as of yet.

Staff Development Day went well. We discussed First Amendment Audits (filming in the Library) and we had a presentation from the Edison Police Department on Active Shooter Training.

We are in the process of upgrading the emergency telephone service network in our two elevators, communications with our alarm systems and ensuring that all of our HVAC systems are in working order as we start the summer season.

The Library has been selected as one of 10 in a pilot project sponsored by the NJ State Library. We will have a Social Work Intern starting in September for the entire year to work with staff and public. This is an exciting opportunity for us.

The New Jersey Library Association Conference this year proved to be excellent with much food for thought. The theme was Sustainability. That words means more than just conserving energy it about everything we do as Libraries from how we operate internally to our external communication. I hope to review some of the data that we talked about at conference and see how we can translate that here at the Library. Besides several library staff members attending the conference this year, Pat Massey represented the Library Trustees.

We continue to work through the North Edison construction project. Our next meeting with SAGE Arch is this Friday, June 16th.

Our lucky day collections for children were such a hit that there were no books left in 2 days anywhere! More titles to come.

We expect our 2021 audit to be completed shortly. Suplee, Clooney was waiting for the return of funds from 2020 and 2021 to be added to the balance sheet and reviewed again capital expenditures and the capital plan. The Township has alerted us that we will be getting a check for any outstanding purchasing orders from 2021 and we will be working on ensuring that we are up-to-date with any outstanding invoices. They will then begin the 2022 audit once the Township has completed their audit.

Debra has been working to ensure that all our information is correct and up-to-date on staff and retiree health plans as we move forward with continuing to work with the Township on the Shared Services Agreement.



Michael B. has been working with Caroline on programs for Pride Month and Hispanic Heritage Month. He has also been working at all three of the branches.

Jenna has been working on the suggested reading lists for various grades as well as a Fathers' Day take and make craft. She is also working at the three branches.

Jessica hosted three storytimes and order youth books.

Claire will be leaving the Library in June. It's been such a pleasure working with her. She is a very hard worker and Edison was lucky to have her. We wish her continued success and she will be missed.

Buildings and Grounds:




