Edison Public Library Director's Report

July 11, 2023

Radha and I met with reps from the Bro Dart Company to expand our book purchasing from them. In addition, we have received training on their extensive inventory of items to be purchased.

Pat Massey and I have met with SAGE Arch architects several times this past month to continue to work on the North Edison Branch Project. We are beyond concept at this point and have defined and redefined spaces within the Library that will be flexible as the Library changes in the next decade. The Director has been talking to Construction (Project) Mangers and have been received proposals from them which have been shared with the Facilities Committee.

The Director has met with the Policy, Personnel and Facilities Committee this past month. Chairs of those Committees will provide the Board with a complete report.

Summer Reading "All Together Now" is in full swing in all Branches and for all ages. I invite the Library Board to encourage friend, neighbors and family members to attend the wide array of programs and to sign-up for weekly and grand prizes. A full list of programs are included in the monthly calendar of events, on the Library's website and promoted daily though our very successful e-mail blasts.

After several months of planning the Bookmobile is now officially back on the road after a hiatus of 4 years. Our summer schedule is available at end one of the branches in paper, on our website and promoted weekly though email blasts. The currently schedule runs through the end of August. I hope that each one of the Board Members will visit the Bookmobile at least once during the summer and check-out our offerings.

As I mentioned Summer Reading is in full swing and we have expanded programming in all our branches. Clara Barton also has a variety of flicks that are aimed at adults, children and families. A good place to visit in these hot humid dog days of summer to cool off.

We have experience Air Conditioning issues at Clara and North and these emergency repairs have been made. AFA is currently in the process of upgrading our communications systems for fire and burglary. We are waiting for Atlas to begin work on updating the outdated phone systems in the elevators as required for code inspection. Fire extinguishers are next on the list to be inspected as required by the Fire Marshall on his recent visit to Clara Barton.

The Library and Foundation are expecting to hold a meeting of the Friends of the Library later this month. We are waiting for the core group of those interested to suggest some proposed dates for the meeting then we can publicize them.

The Director has been working as the Library's liaison to the Northstar Users Group. More details to come shortly as we incorporate this into our offerings. This is certification software for computers and office products. Patrons will be able to sign-up and through self-paced learning be certified in these applications.

I was called on to host one of our programs during Pride Month, on Stonewall. Although the attendance was not overwhelming it provided members our community an opportunity to learn more about the Stonewall uprising, Museum and Archives. A turning point for the Gay rights movement.

Debra and I have been interviewing for some entry level Library Assistant positions.

The Director attended the annual conference of the American Library Association in Chicago. I have attached an article from PW which highlights the conference for you for further reading. One highlight of the conference was the "bus" tour which I took of the Chinatown and Independence Branches of the Chicago Public Library and of the Skokie, IL Public Library. All three provided me with ideas for our current renovations and expansion from many perspectives. The programs

attened ranged by Alzheimer's & Dementia to listening to Judy Blume to hearing AAPI authors discuss their works to Amanda Gorman talking about a new children's book she has written. The vendors' hall provided me with new resources for books and materials on China and South Asia and well as new software to manage our Museum Pass Program to new furniture in all shapes and sizes for our renovations. It was a fantastic but exhausting conference. I brought back so many new ideas for programs and services we can initiate here in Edison over the next year.


Our Library has been nominated for an IMLS National Medal. The National Medal for Museum and Library Service is the nation's highest honor for institutions that make significant and exceptional contributions to their communities. Since 1994, IMLS has presented the award to outstanding libraries and museums of all types and sizes that deeply impact their communities. There is an application process which we need to complete by September 1 for consideration for 2024. It is an honor that we have been nomination even at their initial stage.

The Township has released the proposed Master Plan 2023 for Edison. In this 195 page document, there are reference to the Library on pages: 101, 106 and 199. It does not include any recommendation for additional branches or for a new Central Library. The plan can be accessed online at:

Edison Public Library Assistant Director's May Report

July 11, 2023

Assistant Director:

School is out and summer is here. The library branches are seeing more traffic of families coming in and looking for books and things to do. As ever, the North Edison Branch remains our busiest branch; but the Main Library's tables and computers upstairs in the adult section are frequently full and families are in and out throughout the day. Clara Barton has also had an increase in activity and people are showing up for the summer movie series which is great!

Last month we lost both Claire and Diane from adult services and circulation respectively. We wish them both continued success in all of their future endeavors.

I had a lovely opportunity to cover the library system while Allan was at NJLA and ALA. All three buildings plus the bookmobile remain intact and operable. June was just as busy as ever with staff training, staff absent, programs, and various little fires that needed tending. As mentioned at the June meeting, we were lucky to be able to schedule Edison Police Department's Lt. Corforte for active shooter training for the library's staff development day. He was very informative and I hope to run some of the library's emergency procedures by him once they are more formally drafted. I worked with Emily's onboarding process and she got to visit all three branches. I was able to interview a candidate for a part-time library assistant position with the circulation department supervisors and will interview another for full time mid July. I ended the month by attending committee meetings with Allan.

Patron Services and Programming:

Caroline has been busy planning and coordinating the summer reading kickoff events and programs for the next few months. She has created a workflow for program suggestions and has met individually or in small groups with the librarians and library associates to discuss programming within the library system. She also created the Beanstack summer reading challenge. She continues to fill in as the teen librarian and she ended the month of June by attending the ALA conference in Chicago.

Jessica has been focusing on weeding the youth collections at the three branches. She has also been doing storytimes. She met with Emily regarding storytimes and youth services. Hopefully, she, Emily, and Jenna will be able to meet soon to discuss the youth service's department goals.

John has been working on finalizing the bookmobile schedule. He has been working with others on the bookmobile's dedicated collection. He attended NJLA. He has handed over staff scheduling for the Clara Barton branch to Kathy and worked with her

on updating the branch calendar. He has also picked up Claire's Monday Morning Book Club.

Lonnie has been working more at the Clara Barton Branch to give him some off desk time to focus on program planning. He is working on programs for the fall. He has taken over the Page Lovers Book Club.

Michael B attended NJLA. He has transitioned into more of an adult services role and has been working on some of his first programming assignments. He has taken over the Bookies Book Club from Claire.

Emily has been here almost a full month! She is currently helping Jessica with weeding the youth services collection at Main. She has also been assisting Caroline with programming and attended all three of the summer reading kickoff events. She will be doing her first storytime for the library on July 11th and traveling between the Main Library and the North Edison Branch more frequently.

Jenna has been filling in at adult services after Claire's departure. She continues to work on making crafts and 'take and makes' for families to take home. She has been doing a great job working with patrons at the service desks and making sure they are able to leave the library happy.

Buildings and Grounds:

Robbie and Tyler set up the voting machines at the Main Library and the Clara Barton Branch. They continue to do program and event setups for the meeting rooms. Robbie has also been coordinating with Hughes regarding Clara Barton's and North Edison's air conditioners.

Circulation:

Sandra and Zenaida have been working on various projects in support of the librarians. They have been preparing their departments for the summer reading programs and working on the neverending scheduling. Now that summer reading has officially started, we are seeing more families in the library branches looking for materials. Both Sandra and Zenaida sat in on a preliminary interview for a part time library assistant position and will meet with me and a full time candidate next month.

Communications and Marketing:

Michael W continues to promote programs and materials via email and social media. He created new templates for program flyers and website slides. He attended the Summer Reading Kickoffs at Main and the North Edison Branch. He refined the bookmobile schedule and services handout, which is now pending Allan's approval. He added information regarding the Friends of the Public Library to the library's website. He has also begun compiling museum pass information for handouts and promotion.

Technical Services:

Radha continues to fill in as the Head of Collection Services. She is also being kept busy as the Supervisor of the North Edison Branch and with scheduling issues..

Michael B continues working with the collections and covering both the adult and youth services desks as needed.

Heather is processing incoming materials. She has also been preparing materials for sustainable shelves due to weeding by the librarians. She maintains the new books and book displays when at the desks.

Periodically Mary and Manju have also begun processing new materials as needed.

Technology and Innovation:

Kevin and Priti had a very busy month, in addition to maintaining the library's network and physical machines, they also had to deal with the after effects of a power surge at the North Edison Branch which knocked out the phones and patron computers. The surge alerted them to the fact that the backup batteries had expired and one was leaking. The township said they would not dispose of the batteries and the library would have to coordinate it with the monthly recycling program by the county.

Kitty and Erin are working on makerspace programming. Things got hectic with the end of the school year as students were "more energized than usual." Open hours have been shut down at the Main Library due to needing storage space for the RFID materials, however they are taking individual appointments at the North Edison Branch.
