
# Middle School

SUMMER LITERACY CHALLENGE 2025



#### **Parents and Students:**

The Edison Middle School Summer Literacy Challenge offers students the opportunity to expand their learning through books and a variety of media platforms.

All students in Grades 6-8\* are <u>expected</u> to read at least **TWO books** of **their choice**. There will be **NO** assignments or assessments. We want students to read solely for pleasure. When students return to school in September, they will share some of their favorite titles and takeaways with their peers. (\*Students in Grade 8 Accelerated have a different reading assignment- see below.)

We know that students may want or need additional challenges over the summer. Therefore, we have provided several options to explore. However, no challenge goes unrewarded!

For every challenge students choose to tackle and master, they will **complete a form** in order to enter into their school's raffle. In September, we will pull winners from each school to receive prizes.

\*Please note: Students in **Grade 8 Accelerated** must read *The Outsiders* and complete a separate assignment from the one listed above (See <u>Slide 3</u>). However, they may also choose to complete the additional challenges.

# Grade 8 Accelerated Assignment (Click on either link to access the texts, organizer, and assignment)

You are required to read <u>The Outsiders (S.E. Hinton)</u>, "Nothing Gold Can Stay" (Robert Frost), and ONE nonfiction <u>article as your summer reading requirement</u>. You are expected to be familiar with the details of all the texts and to <u>come prepared with your one-pager</u> and written response on <u>the first day of instruction</u>.

Select ONE of the following essential questions to guide your reading of *The Outsiders*, "Nothing Gold Can Stay," and one of the nonfiction articles.

- What is social justice?
- How do we form our personal identities?
- What do we learn about ourselves through hardship?
- How do our choices impact us and those around us?

Create a one-pager that responds to the selected question and incorporates the required elements. (See requirements, templates, models, and rubric)

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.




